The Tax Advantages of Planned Giving

During tax season, many people realize that they would like to have additional tax deductions in the future. We can help with that! Here are some ideas on how you can both give to Special Olympics and save on taxes.



Gifts Of Cash: If you itemize, you can

lower your income taxes simply by writing Special Olympics a check. Outright gifts of cash are fully tax deductible.

Gifts Of Stock: If you own stock, it can be even more tax-wise to contribute stock than cash. A gift of appreciated stock generally offers a two kinds of tax savings. First, you avoid paying capital gains tax on the increase in value of the stock. Second, you receive an income tax deduction for the full fair market value of the stock at the time of the gift.

Life Income Gifts: If you own stock that is paying low dividends, a "lifeincome" gift or charitable gift annuity (CGA) may be an appropriate gift. You can transfer the stock to Special Olympics and establish a CGA that will provide you with a fixed payment. This income would be paid to you and/or a loved one for life, after which the assets would be distributed to us. Through such an arrangement, you can increase your income and make a meaningful (and tax-deductible) contribution to Special Olympics at the same time.
