
Helpful Resource to Overcome the Challenges of Neurodiversity while Traveling

Many parents will admit that traveling by air with children can be a challenge. This is especially true for families with children who are neurodivergent, a term that refers to people with conditions such as autism spectrum disorder, attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD) or other forms of neurological or developmental disabilities.

Unfamiliar sounds, smells, food, jet lag and changing schedules are extremely difficult for these children to manage. Disruptions and unfamiliar things may cause behavioral issues that make travel difficult for families. In fact, some families do not take family vacations because it is simply too difficult.

Through a recommendation of a teacher, Rudolpha began competing in Special Olympics. "While there, I was among people like me, doing things and going places that most 'normal' people either could never or would never do," Rudolpha says.

She became a high school graduate at 19, competed in Virgin Islands Special Olympics and won medals, worked for Good Will, then moved to the Atlanta area and became a Global Messenger. She was selected in 2013 as one of the members of Georgia's Volleyball team to represent the United States in the Special Olympics World Summer Games in Ireland.




Emily Hamilton
